Wear eye protection.

How can we find out which materials contain carbonates?

Carbon dioxide is formed when an acid is added to a carbonate. Carbon dioxide is a gas. You can see that a gas is being made because the acid will 'fizz'.

Apparatus

- Eye protection
 Test tube rack
- Boiling tube
- Hydrochloric acid
- Materials to test

Method

- **1** Collect the materials you are going to test, and write their names in the table.
- **2** Put one of the materials into a boiling tube.
- **3** Add five drops of acid to the tube.
- **4** Watch carefully, and write your observations in the table.
- **5** Ask your teacher what to do with the material you have left. Wash out the test tube.
